“Think about the risks that are in your area. You know if we’re making a plan for a family well add the animals to your plan and then get the pieces of an emergency kit or equipment that would allow you to deal with your animals in the same fashion that you would with your family”

“You have to look at all the animals that you’re responsible for and if you’re feeding and watering them then you’re going to be responsible to do something with them in the times of emergency and if it’s nothing else then contacting the owners and they’re going to come and do it, then that’s your plan and that works too”
